Matt 18: 15-20 - New International Version (NIV)

“If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that ‘every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.’ If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector.

“Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.

“Again, truly I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything they ask for, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them.”

Matt 18:15 - 20

I'm sure you've all heard the saying, 'good things come in small packages.'

Yes?

If I said that The Bible isn't a particularly small package, would you agree?

In fact, any guesses as to how many chapters it contains? (1,189)

What about verses? (31,273)

However, I don't think that it's too much of a stretch to suggest that each verse could be considered a small package.....many of them real gems!

Today's reading only has 5 verses: so, we could perhaps be forgiven for thinking that 5 out of 31,273 isn't going to have very much to say to us!

Definitely wrong, because all 5 verses have something specific to say to us to help us live as God intends us to.

So, first up, all this stuff about going to someone and showing them where they are at fault.

Ummm – that could potentially be confrontational.

What exactly is Jesus saying to us here?

Well, these first 3 verses are Jesus' guidelines for dealing with those who sin against us: and there are some important factors to remember:

- These verses relate to Christians, not unbelievers
- They refer to sins committed against us personally, not against others
- They are a mechanism for conflict resolution in the context of the church and not the wider community

Although, having said that, we should apply all of Jesus' teaching to our lives outside church as well.

So, how could someone sin against us?

Well, of course, there are really big issues sometimes, but often it could be that they might say something hurtful and unkind directly to us; or we may hear from someone else that they have maligned us in some way; or they may have spoken unnecessarily sharply and harshly to us; or they might have done something which they really should have discussed with us before the deed.

Eg. Liz / staff meeting / Zena / SEN

Within the church setting it could be that someone sets up some sort of children's group without consulting with the relevant people first.

I suspect that by having the courage to do step one, go privately to the person who has wronged you and discuss things together, Jesus was thinking that the other two steps would rarely need to be followed.

And it will take courage to take that first step; as well as wisdom and tact in how we approach the subject with the person. Getting their backs up and antagonising them from the 'get go' will not lead to reconciliation. These will be sensitive situations and must be handled in Christian love.....especially from us, even though we may feel that we are the injured party.

What is very definite about these 3 verses is that Jesus is not giving us permission or licence for a 'head on' frontal attack on every person who hurts or slights us. Nor is he giving us the 'go ahead' to start a destructive gossip campaign or call for a church trial.

These verses are designed to reconcile those who disagree so that all Christians can live in harmony: because of course, we will have differences at times. Apart from having different characters and personalities, we are at different stages in the growth of our faith.

At the beginning of our faith we will have a completely worldly mind set.....which is, so often, at odds and opposite to how God thinks.

2 Corinthians 10:5 says, 'We demolish arguments and every pretention that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought and make it obedient to Christ'.

In other words, we have to shed loads of the way we used to think as we begin to think the way God does.

So, for example, I may have reached a stage in my faith where I don't think that a certain way of behaving and thinking is in line with God's word, but someone else may not have reached that point yet and so wouldn't agree with me.....and that could, if we're not careful, lead to splits and dissension.

It can all be very tricky and delicate, especially as, as Christians, we are in the world but not of the world.

Therefore, when someone wrongs us, the worldly way of handling things is the opposite of what Jesus recommends. Instead of turning away in hatred and resentment, seeking revenge, or engaging in gossip, we should go to that person first, as difficult as that may be.

And, not only that, but we should forgive that person as often as he or she needs it. By doing this we will create a much better chance of restoring the relationship.

We need to remember as well that the other person may be totally oblivious to the fact that they have upset us.

Then, briefly, in verse 18 Jesus talks about loosing and binding. This refers to the decisions of the church in conflicts: and, ideally, the church decisions should be God-guided and based on discernment of his word. So, if believers find that they have to bring their problems to the church, the church has a responsibility to use God's guidance in seeking to resolve the conflict.

Handling problems God's way will have an impact now and in eternity.

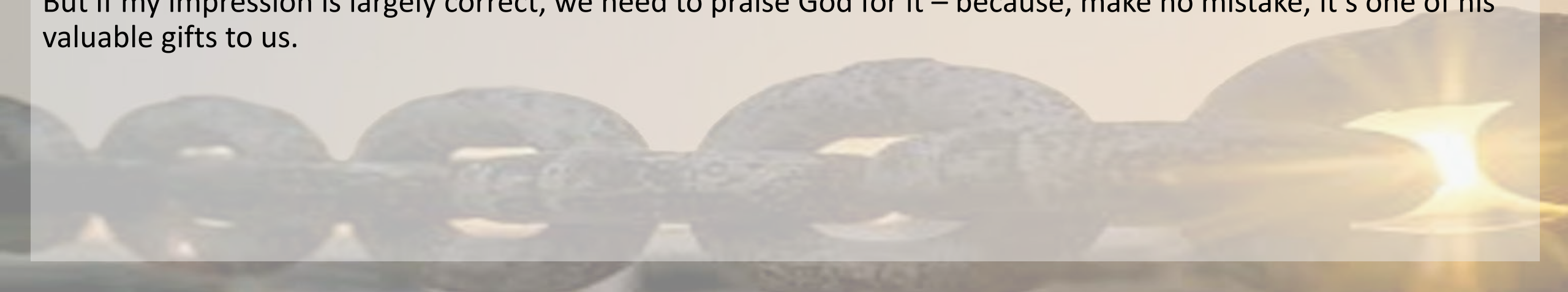

Finally, verses 19 and 20 remind us that in the body of believers (the church) the sincere agreement of two people is more powerful than the superficial agreement of thousands.....because Christ's Holy Spirit is with them. When we are filled with God's Holy Spirit we are more likely to pray according to God's will and not our own.....making it more likely that our requests will be granted.

I actually think that here at St James we are pretty unique in that conflicts don't often arise; I rarely hear of any gossip going on; and, in most things we seem to be pretty much of one mind – the furthering of God's kingdom on Lion Farm.

If I'm completely deluding myself then please come and tell me.....privately first of course.

But if my impression is largely correct, we need to praise God for it – because, make no mistake, it's one of his valuable gifts to us.
